



# **Dakabin State High School 2016 Student Resource Scheme**

## Student Resource Scheme

To assist and support parents/carers with the cost of educational resources Dakabin State High School operates a Student Resource Scheme (SRS). The purpose of the scheme is to provide parents with a cost effective alternative to purchasing textbooks, resources, consumables and/or materials from elsewhere. Parents/Carers are directly responsible for providing their child with textbooks and other resources for their use while attending school.

The Student Resource Scheme is organised by the school and is operated under the policy and guidelines of the Department of Education and Training (DET) and is endorsed annually by the P and C Association. Participation in the scheme is optional but please be aware that if parents choose to not join they must provide all resources that their child will use at school.

Before a student can be considered for participation in a non-compulsory School activity, parents/carers who have joined the scheme are required to be a financial member of the scheme. A financial member is defined as a parent/carer that has submitted the SRS participation form and is currently up to date with their account at the time of the activity. Parents/carers can pay their fees in full; in 3 instalments by the due dates as outlined below; payment plan through Centrelink Centrepay.

Parents/carers who have entered into this agreement are under an obligation to pay fees in exchange for the use of certain resources. Some examples of non-compulsory activities or programs are excursions, camps, Senior jerseys and the Senior formal. Your continued support of the SRS is greatly appreciated.

Parents/Carers are reminded that payments for the SRS should be aligned to the current instalment schedule unless negotiated differently by the Principal or the Business Services Manager. Resources are provided to students in good faith from parents indicating on the SRS Participation Agreement Form their intention to participate in the scheme. It is not viable for the school to provide this service if fees are left outstanding. If a parent/carer has joined the SRS they are obligated to pay the participation fee in accordance to their selected payment method.

Parents experiencing financial hardship are encouraged to contact the Principal or Business Service Manager to discuss payment or resourcing options that may be available to accommodate their circumstances.

Available for eligible families receiving payments from Centrelink. This form is available upon request. Parents/carers must organise this payment through Centrelink. Payment Plans are only available to participants of the Student Resource Scheme.

**2016 Fees**

**Year 7 and 8: \$250** (This covers the cost of compulsory consumable subjects)

**Year 9-12: \$200** (Students who enrol in subjects where there is a consumable fee will need to pay an additional amount dependent on the subject. Please see the costings listed for each consumable subject. Eg If a student selects Hospitality the fees will be \$200 plus \$80 consumable fee so that student's fees will be \$280. Consumable fees must be paid by 05/02/2016)

**Non-Participants of Year 7-12: \$115** This fee is the base fee that must be paid by parents/carers who choose not to be part of the SRS. All other resources including for example textbooks, novels, specific DVDs and any other compulsory classroom materials **must** be supplied by the parent/carer and available for the student to use at the commencement of the 2016 school year.
