Sports Awards Criteria



Sports Awards (Years 7 – 12)

The sports awards listed below relate to National, State, Regional & District sporting pathways available to Dakabin State High School Students.

- Platinum Sports Award recipients were selected to represent Australia at a National School Sports Carnival
- Gold Sports Award recipients were selected to represent Queensland at a National School Sports Carnival and/or selected in a Queensland Team in a non-school affiliated sport
- Silver Sports Award recipients were selected to represent Metropolitan North Region at a State Carnival
- Bronze Sport Award recipients were selected to represent Pine Rivers District at a Metropolitan North Carnival/Trials and/or selected in a representative team in a non-school affiliated sport

Excellence in Sporting Endeavours Award

This is a self-nomination award for any student who has achieved sporting success at a Regional, State or National level in sports outside of Queensland School Sport pathways. Students are to collect, complete & return an application form with evidence that validates the achievement by the nominated due date.

All nominations are required by Week 10, Term 3. Endorsement by a member of staff from DSHS is required for nomination to be considered. No late nomination forms will be considered. A student who meets the criteria may self-nominate and/ or a DSHS staff member may also nominate a student they believe meets the criteria. The nomination form can be located on the school website.

Michael Rosser Award

The student awarded the Michael Rosser Award has demonstrated the following:

- Involvement in extracurricular sport
- Services to school sport

The award is decided by the HPE Department in consultation with the Senior Leadership Team at DSHS.



Cameron 'Shorty' Pearce Award Sponsored

The student awarded the Cameron 'Shorty' Pearce Award has demonstrated the following:

- A Year 12 student
- Commitment, enthusiasm and teamwork in Basketball

The award is decided by the Leadership Team in consultation with the Academy Coordinator at DSHS.

Junior & Senior Sports Encouragement Awards

The student awarded the Junior or Senior Sports Encouragement Award has demonstrated the following:

- A commitment to school sport (in an interschool sport and/or an extracurricular sporting competitions)
- Demonstrated improvement on and off the field in all aspects of their schooling

The award is decided by the HPE Department in consultation with OneSchool Data and the Senior Leadership at DSHS.

Basketball Academy Junior Student of the Year

The Basketball Academy Junior Student of the year goes to the student with the highest results in Basketball Academy Years 7 – 9. This student will have represented the school in either interschool sport Basketball or one of the junior tournament teams.

The qualities that the award recognises include:

- A Year 7, 8 or 9 Student
- **REPRESENTED** Dakabin SHS in a Tournament Team
- **ACADEMIC** Highest academic results in the Basketball Academy
- **ATTITUDE** Willing to help others; makes selfless contributions
- **PERSONAL CONDUCT** Exemplary behaviour and effort at all times (no suspensions)

The award is decided by the Principal in consultation with the Senior Leadership Team and the Academy Coordinator at DSHS.



Basketball Academy Senior Student of the Year

The Basketball Academy Senior Student of the year goes to the student with the highest results in Basketball Academy Years 10 – 12. This student will have represented the school in either interschool sport Basketball or one of the junior tournament teams.

The qualities that the award recognises include:

- A Year 10, 11 or 12 Student
- **REPRESENTED** Dakabin SHS in a Tournament Team
- **ACADEMIC** Highest academic results in the Basketball Academy
- **ATTITUDE** Willing to help others; makes selfless contributions
- **PERSONAL CONDUCT** Exemplary behaviour and effort at all times (no suspensions)

*The recipient must complete a nomination form to be considered for this award. The award is decided by the Principal in consultation with the Senior Leadership Team and the Academy Coordinator at DSHS.

Basketball Academy All-Rounder Achievement Award

The student awarded the Basketball Academy All-Rounder Achievement Award has demonstrated the following:

- Excelling in Basketball
- Dedicated to helping others in the Academy
- A role model to all students in the school
- Shows commitment, enthusiasm, cooperation and support towards all members in the team
- Demonstrates high level of respect for the principles on which the academy is based both on and off the court

The award is decided by the Leadership Team in consultation with the Academy Coordinator at DSHS.

Senior Team of the Year

Students awarded the Senior Team of the Year Award have demonstrated the following:

- A Year 10, 11 or 12 student who is part of a Dakabin SHS sporting team
- Exceptional performance in an extra-curricular sporting competition

The award is decided by the Leadership Team in consultation with the HPE Faculty at DSHS.



Junior Team of the Year

Students awarded the Junior Team of the Year Award have demonstrated the following:

- A Year 7, 8 or 9 student who is part of a Dakabin SHS sporting team
- Exceptional performance in the interschool sport competition and/or an extra-curricular sporting competition

The award is decided by the Leadership Team in consultation with the HPE Faculty at DSHS.

Olympic Changemakers Award

The Australian Olympic Change-Maker™ program recognises students (Years 10 -12) who are demonstrating the Olympic spirit - friendship, sportsmanship and striving for excellence – both on and off the playing field, through leadership and driving positive change in their school or local community. Students are nominated by the school and are then invited to attend the virtual Olympic Changemakers Forum. It is recommended that nominees submit a 1minute video that may gain them an invitation to the National Olympic Change Makers summit in December of 2021. All students who are nominated by the school will receive an invitation to attend the virtual Olympic Change Makers Summit, an exclusive invitation to be part of the Australian Olympic Change-Maker Alumni and a certificate of recognition.

Students awarded the Olympic Change Maker Award have demonstrated all or some of the following:

- A Year 10, 11 or 12 student that has been nominated by the school (up to 2 from each school can be nominated)
- Completed the required application form and process
- Demonstrates attributes consistent with the Olympic spirit both on and off the playing field.
- Actively demonstrate leadership through sport in their school or local community and/or using sport as a vehicle to improve health and wellbeing and drive social change in their school or local community.

The award is decided by the Leadership Team in consultation with the HPE Faculty.

House Spirit Cup

The House awarded the House Spirit Cup is the House who has accumulated the greatest number of House points throughout the year. House points are allocated for all sporting carnivals as well as a wide range of other school activities.

The award is decided by the accumulation of House points throughout the year.



Most Outstanding Sporting Performance

The student awarded the Most Outstanding Sporting Performance Award has submitted a successful 'Excellence in Sporting Endeavours Award' and upon consultation with the Leadership Team as well as the HPE Faculty, has been deemed to have excelled above all others in their extra-curricular sporting activity.

Dakabin Gift Winner

The student awarded the Dakabin Gift Winner has won the Dakabin Gift 100m sprint race at the Athletics Carnival.

- This race is a handicapped event that involves all students from their respective categories who won the 100m sprint.

Junior Athlete of the Year

The student awarded the Junior Athlete of the Year Award has demonstrated some or all of the following:

- A Year 7 - 9 student
- Selection in representative teams at a District, Regional, State and/or National level across one or more sports
- Represented the school in extracurricular sporting competitions
- Won age champion for the Athletics Carnival and/or Cross Country
- Placed 2nd or 3rd after the age champion in the Athletics Carnival and/or Cross Country
- Participated in a Dakabin SHS interschool sports team throughout the year

The award is decided by an accumulation of points for the above-mentioned sporting achievements.

Senior Athlete of the Year

The student awarded the Senior Athlete of the Year Award has demonstrated some or all of the following:

- A Year 10 - 12 student
- Selection in representative teams at a District, Regional, State and/or National level across one or more sports
- Represented the school in extracurricular sporting competition/s such as BOSL
- Won age champion for the Athletics Carnival and/or Cross Country
- Placed 2nd or 3rd after the age champion in the Athletics Carnival and/or Cross Country

The award is decided by an accumulation of points for the above-mentioned sporting achievements.



Athlete of the Year – Point Allocations

Each student will be allocated points based on their highest level of achievement in sport. The allocated points for each representation is listed below. The point tally is not compounded. For example, if a player makes the Pine Rivers District team, then the Met North team, the students will only be awarded points for the highest level of representation. In this example they will be rewarded 10 points (Met North Level) not 13 points for Pine Rivers District and Met North representation.

The students awarded the Extracurricular Sporting Team Most Valuable Player Awards have demonstrated some or all of the following:

- Excelling in their chosen extracurricular sport
- Shows commitment, enthusiasm, cooperation and support towards all members in the team
- Demonstrates high levels of respect for the principles of good sportsmanship and teamwork both on and off the field.

This award is decided by the respective coaches for each team.
